

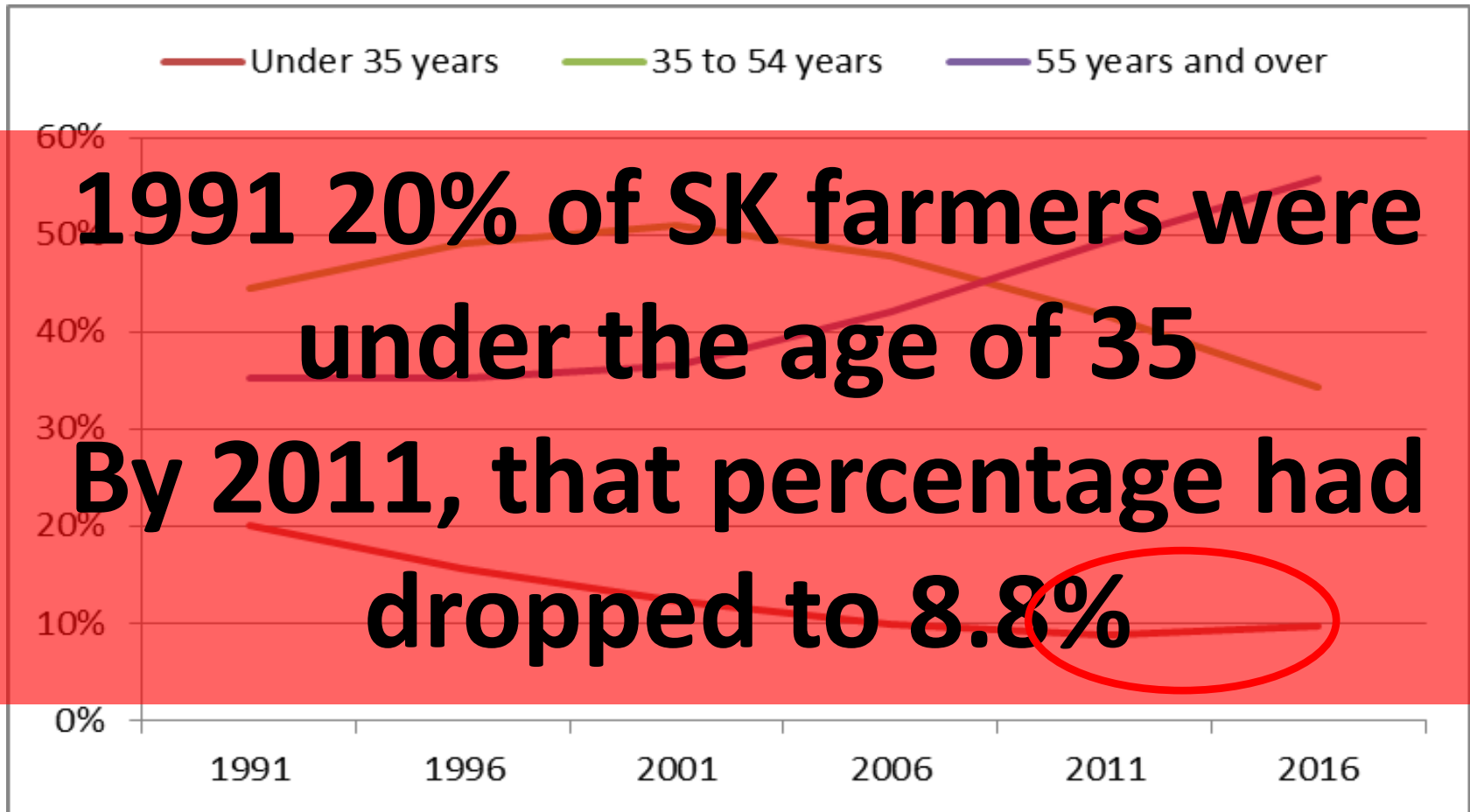

# Young Cow-Calf Operators

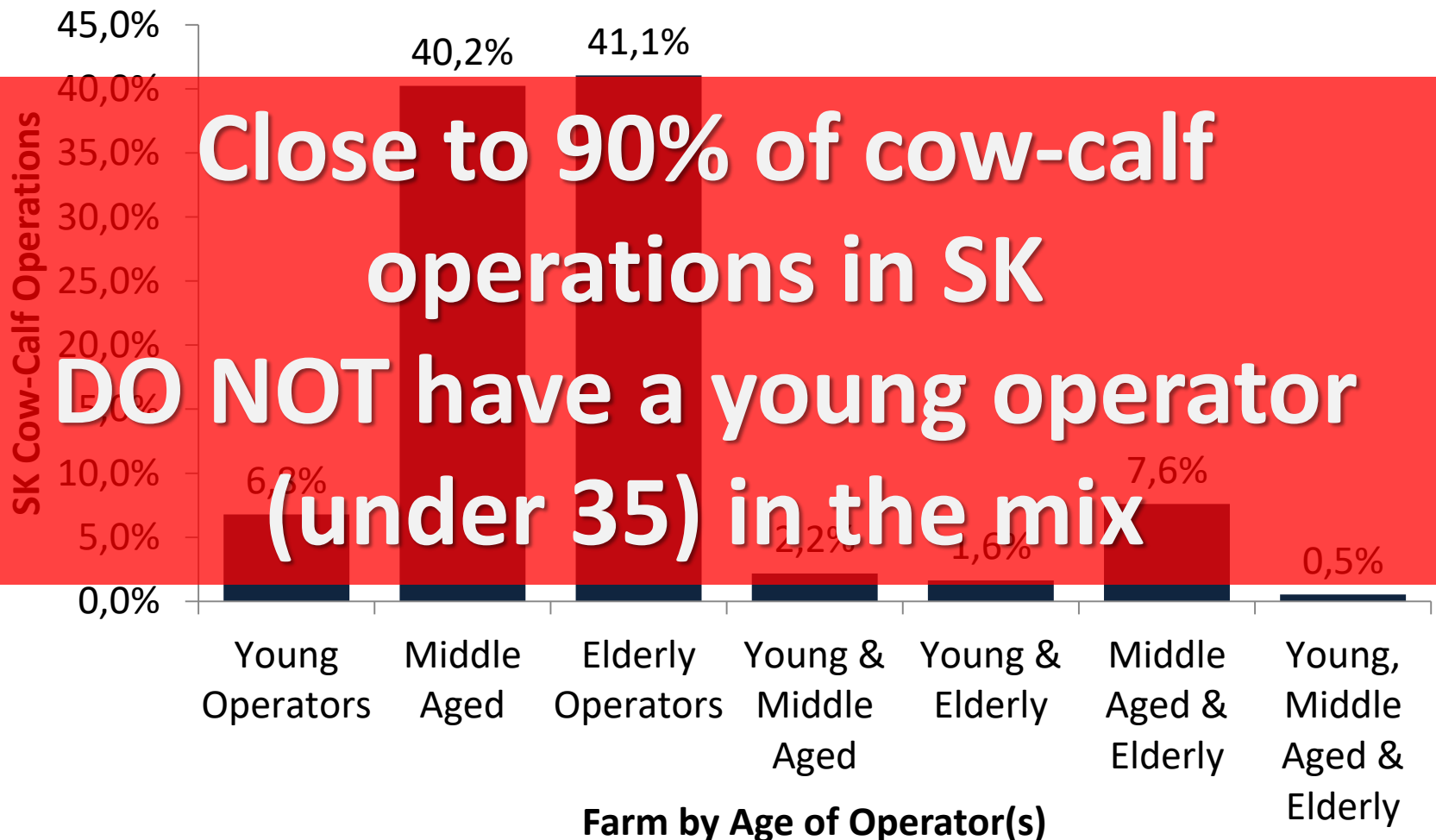
There are **36,952 farms** in Saskatchewan

**15,372** (41.5%) of them have **cattle**

**1,551** cow-calf with a young operator in the mix

**946** ran solely by someone Under 35

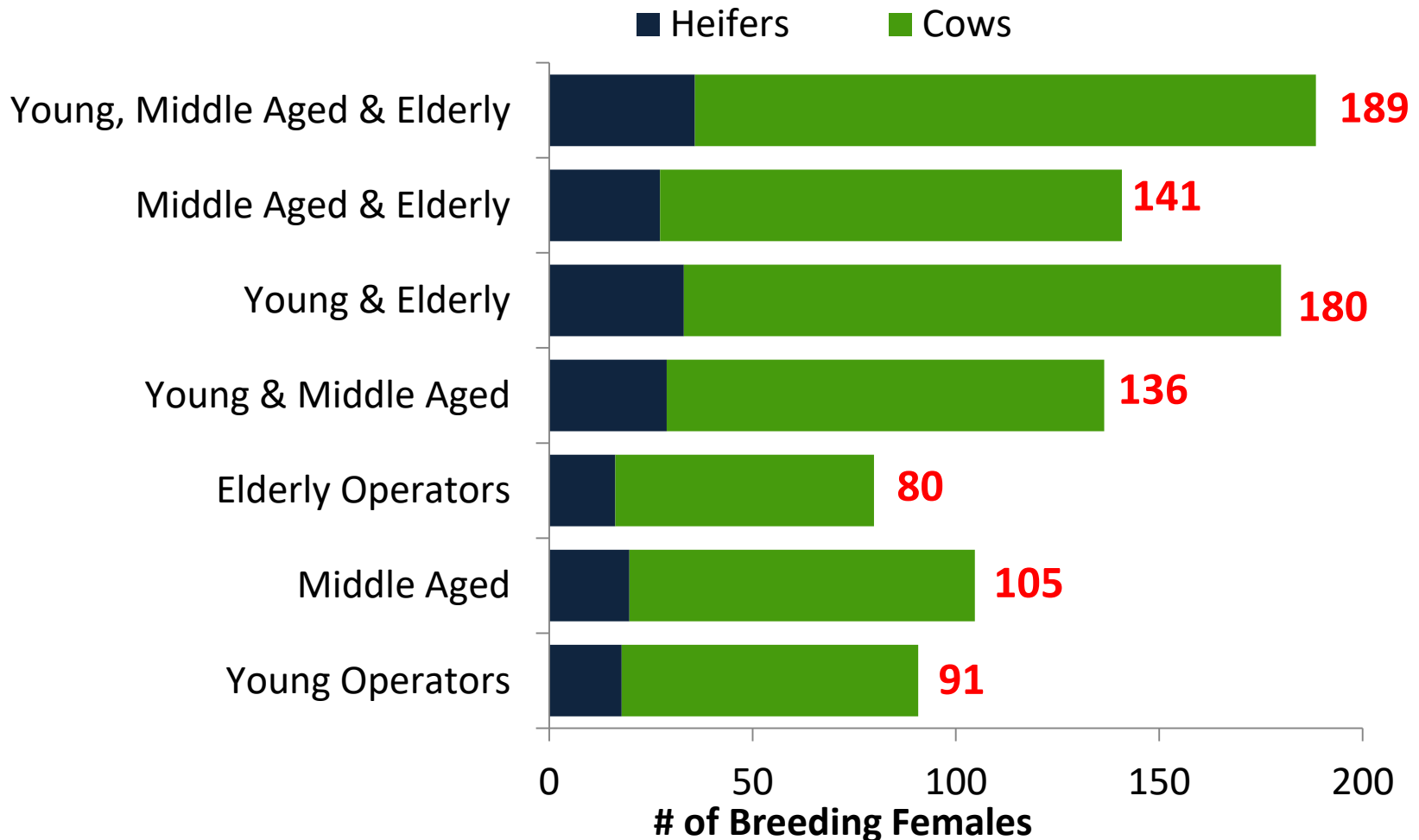
# SK Cow-Calf Operations by Age of Operators

# SK Cow-Calf Operation Herd Size, by Age of Operator

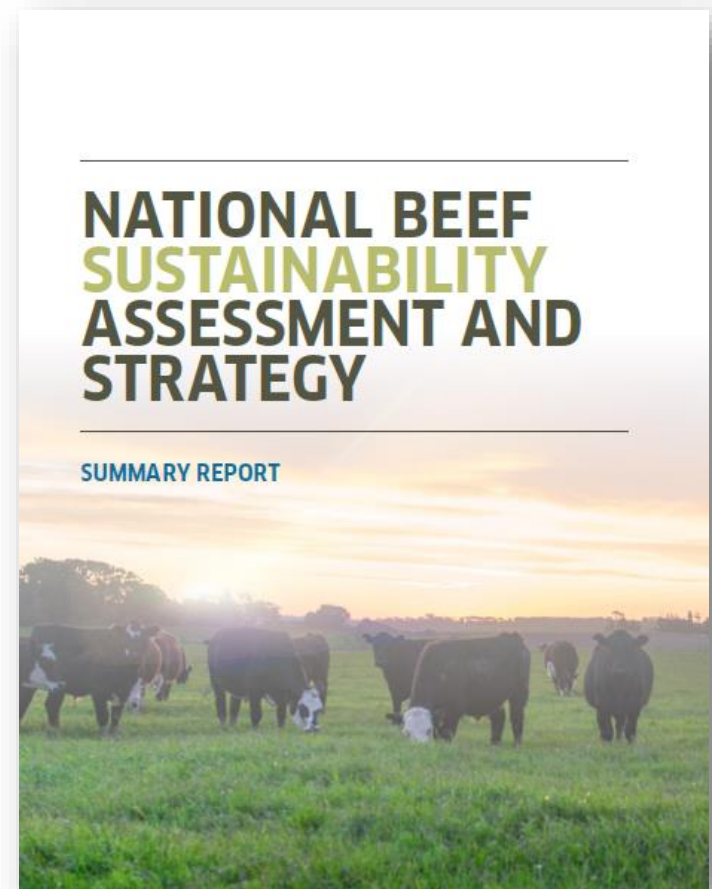

# CRSB Report – October 2016

- Environmental, Social and Economic Assessments
- Small margin business
- Family of 4: 200 cows in 1990 → 800 cows in 2013 to maintain beef income
- Retirement Plan → appreciation in land value

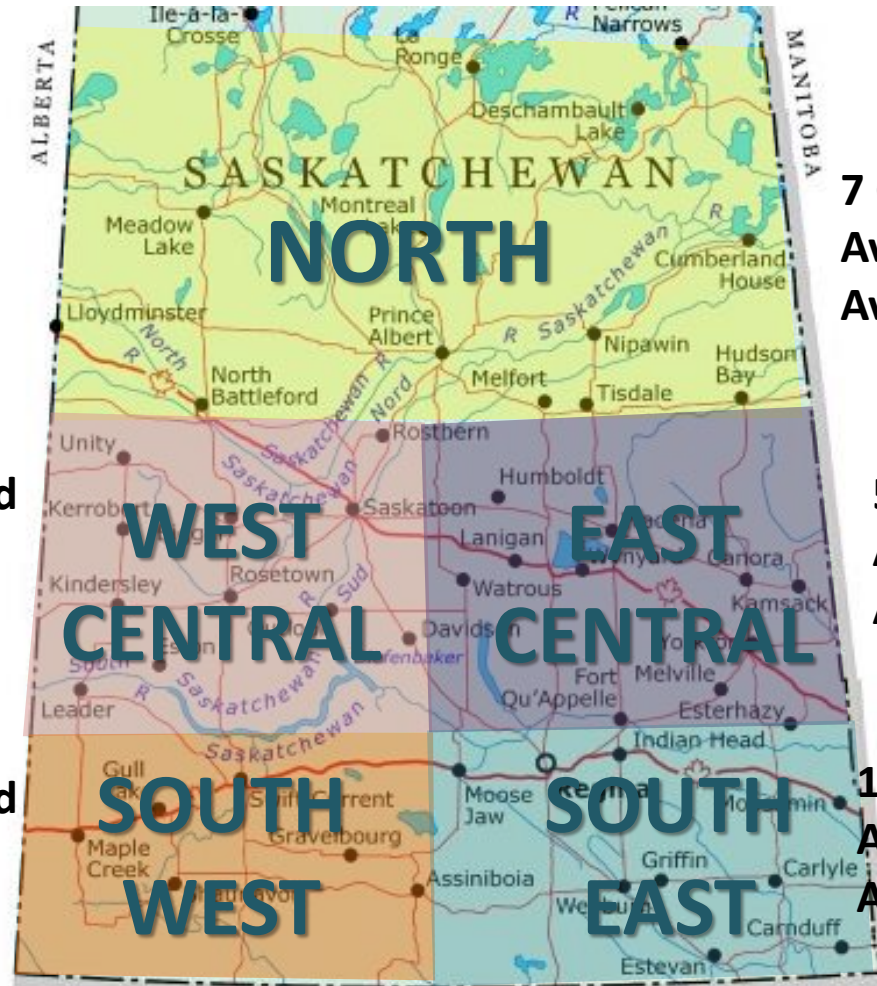

# Young Rancher Case Study

- Interviewed 35 cow-calf ranchers under the age of 35
- Inquired about:
  - management and marketing practices
  - land, labour, and capital needs
  - opportunities & threats they are facing
- Operations ranged in size from 15 to 1500 COWS

**Avg # Cows: 337**

# Young Rancher Study

Married:	74%
Grew up on a farm:	88%
Ranch with parents:	~70%
Avg # Years Raising Cattle:	9
Post-Secondary Education:	77%
Off-farm employment:	44%
Spouse works off farm:	77%

# Young Rancher Study

- 86% indicated need for additional land
- 43% mentioned parents co-signing loans
- 74% got start with or are currently ranching with parents
- Only 17% have completed a succession plan
  - Above SK average of 8.8% (2016 Census of Ag)

# Common Challenges

- Obtaining financing
  - Especially if no cultivated acres
  - Some with less than  $\frac{1}{4}$  deeded
- Accessing close & contiguous land
  - Dealing with as many as 12 landlords
  - Some relocated or are considering relocating
  - >60% of U35 farmers rent land in SK (2016 Census of Ag)
- Cash flowing
  - Have to work off-farm to provide for family
  - 75-84% of cow-calf operations have relied on off-farm income in last 10 yrs (CRSB 2016)
